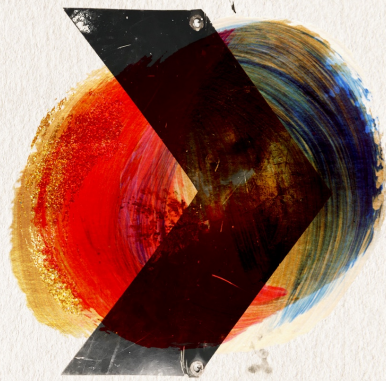

Sermon Discussion Questions



– *Hebrews 2:1-4* – Oct. 21, 2018

- Summarize what we've learned in Hebrews 1 and 2 up to this point. How is the author preparing us for what comes in these verses 2:5-9?
- What objection is the author preparing to handle? (Hint: it's the objection that a man who died couldn't be God.)
- How should we understand Psalm 8 in its original context? How does the author of Hebrews use Psalm 8 to make his argument about Jesus?
- How does the quotation from Psalm 8 summarize the three movements of Jesus' life?
- When will all things be put in subjection to Jesus?
- How does the "suffering of death" contribute to Jesus' exaltation?
- Pastor Joey quoted from Yann Martel's book *The Life of Pi* saying, "I couldn't imagine Lord Krishna consenting to be stripped naked, whipped, mocked, dragged through the streets, and, to top it off, crucified -- at the hands of mere humans to boot... Divinity should not be blighted by death. It's wrong." Why did Jesus consent to crucifixion and death?
- Will you take the time this week to write down a recent experience or two when someone did something on your behalf that you didn't deserve? What, in your own words, did Jesus do for you that you didn't deserve?
