Sermon Discussion Questions

Greater Endurance - Hebrews 13:7-19

- Who had the most influence on you in your faith? How does the memory of their faithfulness inspire your own?
- Do you agree that living a life of Christian worship means we relate to leaders differently than if we weren't Christians? In what practical ways does this make a difference?
- The author of Hebrews writes, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." How does this comfort you?
- Pastor Joey talked about the primary leaders at Faith, the elders. How well do you know our elders? Do you feel cared for and shepherded by them?
- When you think of what a "good" leader looks like, what characteristics come to mind? How has this image been shaped by past leaders with whom you have interacted?
- What could you do to proactively reach out to an elder (or two) and thank them or get to know them?
- Does "submitting" to and "obeying" our elders sound like a joyful idea to you? Or one you react against or shy away from? Why?
- The author of Hebrews says that the leaders in a church must give an account to God for the souls of the people they are leading. How does that fact change the way you look at our leaders, including our elders?
- What is our responsibility, as a congregation, as followers? What is our personal responsibility?
