## Sermon Discussion Questions

### Greater Endurance - Hebrews 13:20-25

- Pastor Joey said “information doesn’t necessarily mean transformation.” Do you agree?
- Have you ever found yourself in a situation where you *know* what to do, but still don’t do it?
- The author of Hebrews ends his sermon with prayer. Why do you think we usually end our Sunday sermons with prayer?
- Pastor Joey said something more is needed to turn information into transformation. What is that something more? How do you get it?
- Do you find God to be the God of Peace? Why or why not?
- Are you able to rest in the forgiveness given to you through Jesus? Why or why not?
- What has the God of peace done, according to Hebrews 13:20?
- Given that the God of peace has raised Jesus from the dead, what does the author of Hebrews ask God to do? How is that request directly tied to the fact that God raised Jesus?
- If you were to ask God to equip you with “everything good,” so that you could do his will, what would that “everything good” be for you?
- Praying the prayer of Hebrews 13:20-21 implies that we lack something we need God to provide for us. How easy is it for you to admit that you lack something, and that God needs to provide it?
- Do you find comfort in the idea that if we are to do God’s will and be pleasing in his sight, that *he* has to do that work in us? Or would you rather do that work yourself?
- How might you and your community group adopt the prayer pattern of the “collect” in your prayers? What benefit might that have for you?
