Sermon Discussion Questions

The Faithful Servant // Isaiah 50:4-11

- Isaiah 50:4-11 gives us a glimpse into the motivation behind Jesus' ministry. How does what we see in Jesus' obedience inform our obedience?
- Pastor Jeff said the key idea from this passage is, "Jesus is Faithful to Help Us." How have you seen Jesus faithful to help you in the past? In the present?
- How does the Servant speak to the weary (Is. 50:4)? What about you?
- How does the Servant engage with the word of God, and how often? What about you?
- Jesus, the Servant, obeyed God even to the point of suffering, physically and socially (Is. 50:5-6). How does our obedience lead to suffering? How does the fear of suffering cause us to hesitate to obey?
- Pastor Jeff said, "If what is coming out of me is anger, fear, and vengeance, then I'm probably being disciplined by someone other than Jesus." In what ways do you find yourself disciplined by other voices?
- When the Servant suffers, how is he helped and upheld by God (Is. 50:7-9)? How have you found yourself helped and upheld by God during your sufferings?

- Pastor Jeff said, “If you’re in the dark and nothing makes sense, don’t light your own fire (Is. 50:10-11) – look to the words of the Servant.” What would our lives look like if we only walked by God’s light, and not our own?
- How do you and your family (or community) need to live in the fact that Jesus is faithful to us?
