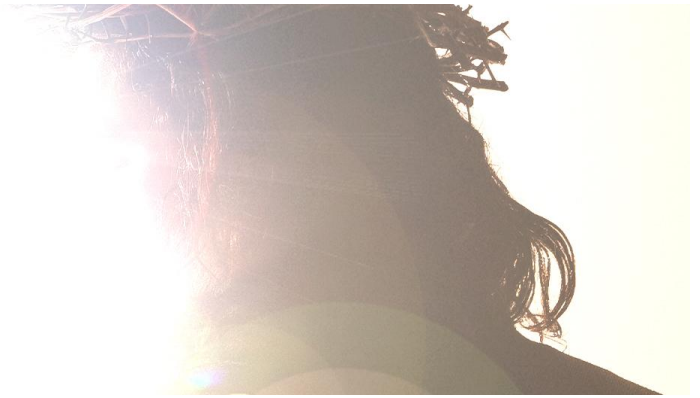


— THE SERVANT — WHO SAVES



Sermon Discussion Questions

The Satisfied Servant // Isaiah 53:10-12

- Do you have any collections or possessions that others might think are irrational purchases, not worth the money you spend on them? What draws you to those objects?
- Pastor Joey said “the more you love something, the more you’re willing to pay for it.” Have you seen that happen in your own life?
- What words from Isaiah 52:13-53:12 describe the price the Servant paid to save God’s rebellious people?
- Isaiah 53:10 says “it was the will (delight) of God to crush him (the Servant)”. Why did God delight in the Servant paying the price for his rebellious people?
- How does the rest of 53:10 explain the payment?
- In Isaiah 53:11, what does the Servant see that makes him satisfied with the price he paid?
- Pastor Joey said “the servant isn’t satisfied with what he goes through because he sees what it gets *him*, but because he sees what it gets *us*.” How does the Servant’s payment apply to you?
- The key idea from this talk was, “Infinite love will gladly pay an infinite price.” Whose love is in view here? What price? For what?

- If it's true that Jesus saw your salvation and was satisfied with what purchasing it cost him, how does that change the way you look at yourself? At your value and worth?
- How does Jesus's infinite love for you transform *what* you love, *how* you love, and *who* you love with?
- What did you learn from this week's sermon that you need to share with others?
