



ACTS 17:10-15

"THE BEREANS"
AUGUST 18, 2024

SUMMARY

In this next installment of our series of acts, Paul is repeatedly interrupted on his way to Rome. Taking one forced detour after another to different Greek cities throughout Rome, he is continually challenged and mistreated as he shares the Gospel faithfully with both Jews and Greeks.

But in Berea, Paul finds a different community. He finds a curious, connected, and committed group of people who discern the scriptures together, leading to faith in Jesus. Because they read the scriptures in the context of their community, they can more easily see Paul's arguments for the messiah and hold each other accountable. Their communal nature knits them together and makes them ripe for receiving the Gospel.

Pastor Joey warned us that few things are more dangerous than someone reading their Bible in isolation. That isn't to say we shouldn't read our Bibles alone and frequently. However, the scriptures should primarily be discerned together in a community. This edifies our Souls, helps us hold each other accountable, and deepens our communion with God.

Today, we must see that our Western individualism/isolationism makes us vulnerable to the misuse of God's word and stunting of our spiritual growth. We need each other to keep us safe from the subconscious manipulation of the scriptures and to keep our hearts soft to God and each other.

Today, let's stir our hearts to desire more of a Bearean community and experience all God has for us through his Church.

DISCUSSION

Western culture is a modern, individualized, isolated culture, while ancient Middle Eastern culture is a Traditional, communal Culture. Each has benefits and challenges.
